Rosechapeau

I created this hat for my friend, Rose. Her favorite color is pink and since she is lucky enough to attend college at Point Loma Nazarene right on the beach, I thought she needed a more lacy, all-weather type chapeau. Since it takes less than 121 yards you can splurge on a nice, luxe yarn! Enjoy!





Yarn: Filatura Di Crosa Baby/Zarella Baby Print by Tahki Stacy Charles

1 skein, 121 yards

Needles: Size 7 Circs, (Addi Turbos, 12" – perfect for hats)

Gauge: 4.5 stitches to the inch

CO 88 stitches. Place marker and join for working in the round. Work in stockinette stitch (knit every row) for 2".

Lace pattern:

Row 1: YO, SSK – repeat to end of round.

Row 2: Knit Row 3: SSK, YO

Row 4: Knit

Repeat rows 1-4 three times (rows 1-12)

Return to stockinette stitch for 2.25"

Lace pattern:

Row 1: YO, SSK Row 2: Knit Row 3: SSK, YO Row 4: Knit

Start Decreases:

Knit 9, K2tog Knit Knit 8, K2tog Knit Knit 7, K2tog Knit Knit 6, K2tog Knit Knit 5, K2tog Knit 4, K2tog Knit 3, K2tog Knit 2, K2tog Knit 2, K2tog Knit 1, K2tog Knit 1, K2tog



Cut yarn leaving about a 7" tail. Remove marker. Thread tail end of yarn through needle and close top of hat. Weave in ends. Steam lightly. Wear with insouciance.
